	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) On the 15th of April, 2022 at 10:22 p.m., police received report of a Mischief at a residence in Neebing Municipality. Police attended and learned of ongoing issues between two neighbours. Police investigated and secured evidence of Assault and Mischief to Property. Charges pending. 2) On the 29th of May, 2022 at 9:57 p.m., police received a call from a Neebing Municipality resident who learned her 12 year old child was consuming marihuana with a friend and the friend's parents. All involved parties educated; young persons warned about possession under the Cannabis Act and parents for being involved. No charges laid. 3) On the 24th of May, 2022 at 1: 38 p.m., police received a call from an adult reporting they located a firearm while cleaning out their late father's residence in O'Connor Township. The firearm turned over to police for disposal. 4) On the 29th of June 2022, at approximately 4:35 p.m., police received a call from a Conmee resident reporting a drone was flying around her yard and crashed. Caller believes the drone belongs to the neighbour and was concerned she was being recorded. Investigation ongoing.

NEEBING MUNICIPALITY

Violent Crime or Other Criminal Code Violations:

- 1 Mischief and Assault – Complainant called police to report her neighbour blew snow at her and into her porch with his snow blower when she was working outside. Police investigated; charges pending
- 1 Impaired Operation & Utter Threats – Police called to CBSA (Canada Border Service Agency – Pigeon River) and arrested a male driver for Impaired and Utter Threats.
- 1 Impaired Operation – Police received traffic complainant of truck racing up and down the road. Driver located passed out at residence. First response and EMS attended to assist male. Police followed up and charged male with Impaired Operation.
- 1 Fraud Under \$5000 – Complainant reports sending \$3920 etransfer for goods not received. Unable to contact company. Referred to Fraud Busters and provided advice on online safety.

- 1 PHAC Compliance – Public Health Authority of Canada request police conduct Covid-19 compliance check. Address attended by police and residents found compliant and isolating.
- 2 R.I.D.E. event at Blake Scoble Road off Hwy 608; 16 vehicles checked, 4 tests: 2 at 0 mgs, 1 – 21 mgs and 1 – 19 mgs. 100% compliance
 - R.I.D.E. event at Hwy. 608 just west of Hwy. 61; 1 vehicle checked, 100% compliance
- 3 Attempt / Threat of suicide – Complainant reports her boyfriend posting suicidal utterances on social media. Male youth taken to hospital under Mental Health Act and admitted on a Form 1 by doctor.
- - Police received report from complainant of male uttering suicidal ideations. Police attended and found male high on drugs; no intent to harm himself or others. No grounds for apprehension.
- - Complainant reports receiving troubling messages from boyfriend. Police attend and youth ok. No intent to harm themselves or others and mental health support.
- 1 Hunting Violation – Complainant reports he suspects his neighbour is hunting small game in early morning around 0400 a.m. Conservation Officer advised.
- 1 Cannabis Act – Police received report from parent that 12 year old child smoking marijuana with friend and their parent's. Police attend and spoke to all involved parties. Complainant did not want charges laid. Parties warned.
- 1 Off-Road Vehicle Act – Complainant reports children riding motorcycles on Boundary Road East. Patrols made with negative results.
- 1 Mental Health Act – Complainant requested assistance to speak with someone regarding on-going neighbour issues. Crisis Worker engaged.
- 1 Other Federal Statutes – CBSA agency reported driver had fail to stop entering with food and firewood. Police cancelled when motorist returned.
- 1 Dog Owner's Liability Act – Complainant reports his spouse making delivery at residence and dog jumped up, scratched their chest and vehicle. Police spoke to owner and warned to have control of dog at all times. Complainant satisfied with police action.

Operational:

- 1 Well-being Checks – Complainant reports overturned canoe, concerned person(s) may need of help. Police attend and determine canoe had drifted.
- 1 Family Dispute – Police received report of family dispute; CAS involved and following up with family
- 5 Non-Criminal Domestic – Complainant reports their spouse making racial slurs; declined statement. Police investigated and dispute over vague wording in separation agreement. No charges laid.
- - Police called to residence where couple had been drinking and both subject intoxicated. Verbal argument, no evidence of offence. No charges laid.
- - Police received report of a couple arguing; police attended and determined

couple only arguing. No evidence of violence or criminal offence.

- - Complainant reports ex-spouse dropped off their child and when backing up, accidentally hit her with his vehicle. No injuries but advised ex-spouse behavior escalating. Police followed up with ex-spouse and complainant. No evidence of criminal offence.
- - Complainant reports domestic situation. Involved in motor vehicle collision. Police attended scene; verbal argument only. No evidence of criminal intent. Complainant issued 3 day suspension after Alert test, driving with alcohol.
- 3 Sudden Death – Police received report of deceased adult off Cloud Lake Road; Ontario Hydro Workers, First Response and EMS attended to provide CPR. Deceased had medical distress, no foul play.
- - Police received report of sudden death on West Oliver Lake Road; expected death. Police, Coroner and Nurse practitioner attended. No foul play.
- - Police conducting joint investigation with Thunder Bay City Police Service with missing person. DNA collected to determine identification on found human remains.
- 3 Neighbour Disputes – Complainant reports ongoing issues with her neighbour making inappropriate comments about her. Police recorded information.
- - Complainant called police to inquire about follow up to an incident involving her neighbour; police contacted and updated complainant; referred to Victim Services
- - Complainant reports ongoing issues with his neighbour; trying to sell house and his neighbour is harassing their real estate agent and pointing multiple cameras at his property. Police contacted neighbour, advised to point cameras away from complainant's property, not to record complainant without their permission and to stop interfering with sale of complainant's house.
- 4 Assist Other Agency – CBSA (Canada Border Service Agency) at Pigeon River requesting police BOLO (Be on Look Out) for male with MHA issues turned around at US Customs. Male not located.
- - CBSA request assistance removing male from border who tried entering US wearing full monkey suit (Freeman on the Land). Male removed to Thunder Bay.
- - CBSA requested Police K9 attend for a drug search of a commercial motor vehicle. K9 attended, search completed without incident.
- - CBSA requests police vehicle and trailer came through Canadian Border without stopping. Police located subject vehicle and trailer. Driver advised mistakenly went through. Police escorted back to CBSA.
- 1 Assist Thunder Bay Police Service – Police called to BOLO for vehicle and male in area of residence in Municipality. Male has made previous threats to partner. Police patrol area; no sign of vehicle or male.
- 1 Assist Ambulance – Police attend to assist with female who was Vital Signs Absent; First Response and EMS attended. Female revived and taken to hospital for assessment. No foul play.

- 2 Keep the Peace – Separating party contacted police to set up time to attend while personal belongings removed from residence.
- - Complainant requested Police attend while dropping off a grandchild. No officer available; suggested to drop off with third party as a witness.
- 1 Police Information – Complainant reports exterior glass door smashed and patio stone chipped. No evidence of break-in, theft or tracks/tires. No security cameras. Photo sent. Neighbours canvassed; no known incidents.

Statutes and Acts:

- 2 R.I.D.E. events – Hwy 590 and Hwy 595; 5 vehicles checked, 0 tests, 100% compliance
- - R.I.D.E. at Loghrin Road and Hwy. 590; 35 vehicles checked, 100% compliance
- 1 Trespass to Property Act – Complainant reports ex-spouse attended property to pick up his belongings without permission. Police spoke to ex who advised a friend picked up his property. No evidence male trespassed.
- 1 Animal complaint – Harstone Road and Smith Road; complainant reports animal bones being discarded in bush. MNRF contacted and advised.

- 1 Phone Calls – Call received from caller but unable to call or text back. Ambulance got through and reported caller not in distress. Tree fell across driveway and unable to drive to work. Police not required.

- - Same complainant reports a request for police to attend so he can pick up his vehicles from ex-spouse's property. Future arrangements made **check**
- 2 Noise Complaints – Complainant reports neighbour has stereo blasting and he cannot hear his own TV. Police cancelled as complainant reported

neighbour turned down his stereo.

- - Police called to same residence later in evening for their music being too loud. Involved owner spoken to and warned. Music turned down, no charges.

- 1 Property related – Complainant who is executor/power of attorney reported sibling removing property off parent's estate and placing them on his property. Male warned to cease removal of property until will is settled.
