<p>Matters of Interest</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) On the 22nd of November 2022 at 4:17 p.m., police received a call from Neebing Municipality reporting a theft of 1000 litres of fuel from a rock crusher parked at the Kivela Road West gravel pit. Police investigated, canvassed area, no security footage and no evidence found. Media release posted. Unsolved. 2) On the 29th of November at 8:21 p.m., police received a call from a Conmee resident reporting an unknown person called advising they accidentally received their parcel and to meet them in Kakabeka Falls. The resident left, did not meet up with anyone and upon returning to their residence, found it had been broken into and items stolen. Forensic Identification Unit engaged and police investigating. 3) On the 10th of December 2022 at 5:18 p.m., police received a call from an O'Connor Township resident who reported a vehicle in the ditch. Police attended; driver tested with Approved Screening Device (ASD) and issued a 3-day licence suspension. Property damage, no injuries and vehicle towed from scene. 4) On the 14th of December 2022 at 1:17 p.m., police received a report from Neebing Municipality advising residents reported logging trucks speeding on Copper Cliff Road East. Focus patrol created and patrols made in the area during school bus times to enforce speed limit.

NEEBING MUNICIPALITY

Violent Crime or Other Criminal Code Violations:

- 3 Mischief calls – Municipality reported mischief to gate lock, unknown persons burnt lock and removed barrier. No security cameras. Insufficient evidence to further investigation. Complainant advised to request directed patrols.

- Time standards displayed are for the 2021 billing period.

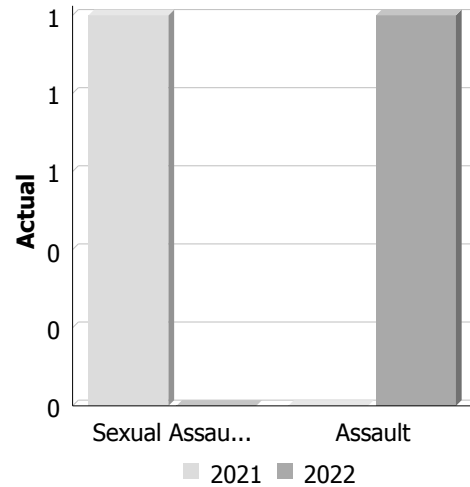
Note to Municipalities:

- Data groupings within this report do not match traditional crime groupings seen in other public reports such as the OPP Police Services Board reports or Statistics Canada reporting.

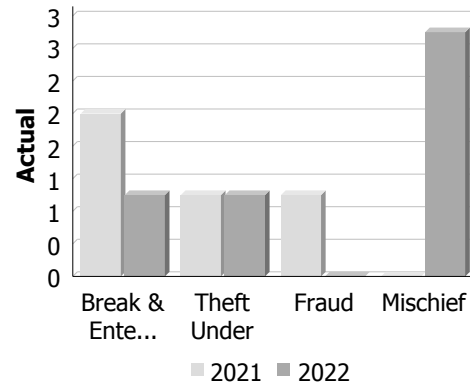
