

#### Tax Sale

There is a proverb that "nothing is certain, except for death and taxes". But what happens if someone owns property and doesn't pay their property tax?

Tax arrears are the amount that remains owing on a property after the tax due date. Arrears have penalties applied to them at a rate of 1.25% per month, and the Municipality sends out arrears notices or statements to the property owner monthly.

In Ontario the Municipal Act sets out the rules for tax collection, and it states that when the arrears are more than two years old, the property becomes eligible for the tax sale process to begin. These years are not calendar years - on January 1, 2022 a property that has arrears dating from anytime in 2020 is eligible for tax sale.

Prior to the tax sale registration, Agriculture Canada will issue a Farm Debt Notice, informing property owners with a commercial farming operation that they can take advantage of a Federal Farm Debt Mediation Service. Non-farm owners can take the debt notice to a financial advisor. Options for property owners at this point include setting up a monthly payment arrangement, making a partial payment of the penalties and taxes more than two years old, or a combination of a lump sum payment and a monthly payment arrangement.

If no payments are made, then a Tax Arrears Certificate is registered on the property. Notices of the registration and final notices are sent to interested parties. When a tax certificate is registered, the only payment option is to pay off the entire balance due on the property.

The tax certificate is registered for a 9 month period, and the property owner can pay the tax sale balance, and even cancel a tax sale, up to the point of registration of the tax deed to the new owner. During the waiting period, in certain circumstances, it may be possible for a property owner to "freeze the clock" with an extension agreement. An extension agreement specifies terms and conditions, and if they are not met, then the clock starts the ticking again.

After the tax certificate has been registered for at least 9 months, the property can be offered for public sale by sealed bid, with the minimum bid being the amount due for taxes, interest, and the tax sale processing fees. Neebing is currently advertising two properties offered for tax sale by sealed bid with the closing date of June 15 at 3 PM. ## What's Been Happening at Council Meetings?

Since the May edition, there has been two regular Council meetings and has also been two Special Council meetings on May 4 and 18. At the Special Council meeting on May 4, Council sitting as Committee of the Whole heard an application for a severance on Salo Road and an application for a validation order for a property on Jarvis Bay Road West. Recommendations from the Committee were ratified by Council at the regular meeting held later the same evening.

At the regular Council meeting on May 4, the following matters were considered:

- Council heard deputations from a member of the public regarding road conditions and from BDO Dunwoody regarding the 2021 Financial Statements.
- Council passed a resolution to support the primary care clinic in Kakabeka Falls.
- Council authorized Administration to provide assistance to Blue Sky Strategic Group with upcoming workshops.

At the Special Council meeting on May 18, Council sitting as Committee of the Whole heard an application for a severance on Cloud River Road West. Recommendations from the Committee were ratified by Council at the regular meeting held later the same evening. At the regular Council meeting on May 18, the following matters were considered:

- Council reviewed and passed the 2022 budget.
- Council passed the by-laws to set tax ratios and tax rates.
- Council directed Administration to prepare for a second round of the FoodCycler food waste diversion program.
- Council directed Administration to submit delegation requests to Ministers at the AMO Conference.

## **Fire Safety Tips** for June



Over the recent months of our seemingly 'perpetual winter', it began to seem that we were perhaps experiencing a foreboding of a two season 'climate change'. Finally, with the arrival of some summer-like temperatures and several episodes of heavy rain, Neebing was able to say farewell to most of our heavy winter snow accumulation. Although the heavy rain-fall conditions resulted in some localized flooding, the welcome heat and moisture appears to have accelerated our Spring transition to near normal conditions. We now enjoy the pleasures of viewing verdant green grass, hummingbirds at the feeders, and perennials such as marsh marigolds and tulips bringing bright colours of spring. For this we are thankful!

We are now free to direct our focus toward the many outdoor summer activities such as; barbequing, gardening, hiking, fishing, swimming, boating and numerous other recreational opportunities that we are so fortunate to have located 'on our doorsteps'. It is now time to redirect our winter fire safety behaviour mode - transitioning from primarily an inside home fire safety focus to now include an outdoor fire safety perspective designed to ensure the safety of our family and guests as they participate in a plethora of outdoor pleasures.

Although a serious wildfire event (perhaps started by a lighting strike) is of real concern in any forested area such as Neebing, most summer fires in Neebing are human caused as residents participate in common summer activities involving; campfires, BBQs, trail riding (when hot exhaust pipes might easily ignite trail grasses), and even smoking. All can quickly generate unintended fire situations, fortunately these fire starts are usually noticed quickly and a 911 call for help ensures that the fire is extinguished before it has the opportunity to grow.

It is important throughout the summer

months to remain diligent in our activities to ensure that we are not creating unnecessary fire threats. For example, - a lit BBQ, positioned too close to a building perhaps to get it out of the wind, can quickly melt or ignite house siding. Similarly, a BBQ positioned inside a garage or shed to get out of the rain, can create a serious CO poisoning hazard! Garage or shed doors must be left wide open to avoid the buildup in CO levels, and allow plenty of fresh air inside! The difficulty in recognizing a CO hazard is that CO is odourless and goes unnoticed until too late. Of particular note early in the season is the reality that wildfire hazard is particularly high during the period between 'snow melt' and 'green-up'. During this time period, last year's leaf/grass debris, as well as fine-fuels collected on the forest floor, provide fuel for an easy fire start. The resulting fire spread is especially rapid during periods of dry, windy and hot weather. Although fire danger conditions improve to a degree following green-up, any extended period of hot, dry weather (such as we experienced last summer) can quickly turn a Low Hazard fire rating to High and Extreme conditions in only a few days.

Be sure to monitor the weather and updates on fire hazard levels over the summer, and adjust your activities accordingly. In High and Extreme fire conditions, simple activities such as cutting grass or trail riding have resulted in fires requiring a Fire team response. When things are hot and dry, a simple spark from; metal blades striking unseen objects in the grass, from hot exhausts and from discarded cigarettes can be sufficient to ignite dry fuels. Remain aware of the fire pre-conditions in your area, as they can vary across a community the size of Neebing, where elevation change and proximity to Lake Superior can result in varied conditions on the same day. Enjoy the Summer! Stay Safe

#### Fire Permits and Fire Safety Tips to Keep Your Summer Fire Safe Summer

A few common safety tips to help with safe summer burning:

- Fire Permits are required for all open fires in Neebing during the summer (fire permits are available 24/7 online at: www.neebing.org)
- No DAYTIME open fires are allowed in Neebing during the fire season.
- Never burn in windy conditions.
- Avoid starting a fire in **High or Extreme Fire Hazard conditions**.
- Never start any fire when a Restricted Fire Zone is in place.
- Burn on calm evenings when humidity levels are highest and winds are low.
- **Ensure** there is a 'fuel free' buffer area between your fire site and other combustible materials. (Fire can spread extremely quickly in fine fuels such as dried grass, whereas green mowed grass, gravel or bare soil will make it more difficult for fire to spread)
- If things start to go wrong with your fire, CALL 911, and get help on

Neebing Fire Permits include a number of necessary requirements that when followed should provide a safe burning experience for the permit holder.



If you wish to make your property more resilient to wildfire threats, take a look at the FireSmart Guidelines. These guidelines are designed to help you identify the fire threats on your property and to make improvements that will enhance the resilience of your property to wildfire threats.

#### Patio Heater Safety Tips

The use of gas patio heaters and outside fireplaces are becoming increasingly popular, both for personal comfort on cool days or evenings, as well as for their aesthetic appeal. While these units do not generally require fire permits prior to their light-up, there are a few fire-safety tips to be considered while using them. If you are using a propane unit as your fuel source, look for a CSA sticker to ensure that the unit meets Canadian safety standards. You also need to be aware that all gas fired units generate heat, so vou must ensure that the unit you are using is placed such that any open flame does not reach within 3' of any combustible material. If you are using a liquid-fueled unit, ensure that the unit is

stable, and that the unit has been turned off and cooled sufficiently to be 'cool to touch'

before refueling. Liquid fuels vapourize quickly and can be readily ignited by residual heat in the unit, potentially causing injury to any persons close by. Additional information on safe use of gas patio heaters can be found at:

#### Be 'Bear Wise' and Prevent Bear Encounters

#### Who to contact

Not every bear sighting is an emergency situation. Here is who to call if you encounter a bear.

#### **Emergency situations**

- Call 911 or your local police if a bear poses an immediate threat to personal safety and exhibits threatening or aggressive behavior, such as:
  - o enters a school yard when school is in session
  - o stalks people and lingers at the site
  - o enters or tries to enter a residence
  - o wanders into a public gathering
  - o kills livestock/pets and lingers at the site
- Police will respond first to an emergency situation, but may request assistance from the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry during daylight hours.

#### Non-emergency encounters

- Call the toll-free Bear Wise reporting line at **1-866-514-2327 (TTY 705-945-7641)** if a bear:
  - o roams around or checks garbage cans
  - o breaks into a shed where garbage or food is stored
  - o is in a tree
  - o pulls down a bird feeder or knocks over a barbecue
  - o moves through a backyard or field but does not linger
- This line operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week, from April 1 to November 30.

#### If you encounter a black bear

When bears are caught off guard, they are stressed, and usually just want to flee.

Stop. Do not panic. Remain calm. Generally, the noisier the bear is, the less dangerous it is, provided you do not approach. The noise is meant to "scare" you off and acts as a warning signal.

#### DO

- Slowly back away while keeping the bear in sight and wait for it to leave
- If the bear does not leave, throw objects, wave your arms and make noise with a whistle or air horn.
- Prepare to use bear spray.
- If you are near a building or vehicle get inside as a precaution.
- Drop any food you may be carrying and slowly move away.
- If a bear is in a tree, leave it alone. Leave the area. The bear will come down when it feels safe.

#### DO NOT

- Run, climb a tree or swim.
- Kneel down.
- Make direct eye contact.
- Approach the bear to get a better look.
- Attempt to feed a bear.

#### Bear warning signs

Black bear attacks are extremely rare. A threatened or predatory black bear will give off warning signs to let you know you are too close. A black bear standing on its hind legs is not a sign of aggressive behavior. The bear is trying to get a better look at you or catch your scent.

#### A defensive bear

A bear that feels threatened will:

- salivate excessively and exhale loudly
- make huffing, moaning, clacking and popping sounds with its mouth, teeth and jaws
- lower its head with its ears drawn back while facing you
- charge forward, and/or swat the ground with its paws (known as a 'bluff' charge)

#### A predatory bear

The bear will approach silently, usually in rural or remote areas, and may continue to approach regardless of your attempts to deter them by yelling or throwing rocks. If the bear attacks:

- use bear spray
- fight back with everything you have
- do not play dead unless you are sure a mother bear is attacking in defense of her cubs

Or simply make a compote by stewing the rhubarb with enough sugar to sweeten. Here is a simple rhubarb chutney recipe to serve with roasted meats or chops throughout the year.

#### RHUBARB CHUTNEY

6 cups sliced rhubarb

1 tsp. whole cloves 1 tsp. salt

5 cups chopped peeled apples

1 tbsp. grated ginger root 1 tsp. cinnamon

4 cups packed brown sugar 1 cup raisins

1 1/2 cups vinegar

1/2 cup water

In a large, heavy pot, combine the rhubarb, apples and sugar. Tie the cloves in cheesecloth. Add to fruit along with the ginger, raisins, salt, cinnamon, vinegar and water.

Bring to a boil and then reduce heat and boil gently, stirring often until thickened in about one hour. Remove the clove bag. Pour into sterilized canning jars. Seal and water process in a boiling water bath for ten minutes. Makes 9 cups.

This second spring recipe is a crustless quiche. Whenever I get asked to a potluck, this is my favourite contribution and it is economical, always a hit, quick to make and easy to transport. It is wonderful for a luncheon, for brunches and suppers. Just add a salad and some crusty bread to complete the dish. Don't be shy to vary the ingredients. For example, try different greens such as spinach rather than broccoli or vary the cheese with some local Gouda cheese.

#### **CRUSTLESS QUICHE**

2 cups chopped cooked broccoli

1 1/3 cups shredded cheddar cheese

1 1/3 cups of milk 1/2 tsp. salt

1 or 2 cups of chopped cooked chicken or diced ham or 1 cup flaked tuna or salmon

2/3 cup of chopped onion

4 or 5 beaten eggs 1/4 tsp. pepper

3/4 cup of Bisquick

Heat your oven to 400. Oil a large pie plate.

In a medium bowl, mix together the chopped broccoli, cheese, chicken or diced ham or drained and flaked tuna or salmon. Mix in the chopped onion.

Pour the mixed ingredients into the large greased pie plate.

Beat the eggs with the milk and the Bisquick mix until smooth.

Add the salt and pepper then pour this on top of pie mixtur. Lightly stir together.

Bake for 30 to 40 minutes until a knife inserted in the center comes out clean.

## The Rural Pharmacist: On The Moooove in Kakabeka Falls: New Location Now Open!

It's hard to believe moving day has arrived. We've watched our new building project develop over the course of the last 9 months as our pharmacy team served the community from our location next door. We've been waiting and looking forward to our new space as we watched each wall go up one at a time.. and now it's here! As of May 30, you can find us in our new location at 4785 Highway 11/17 in Kakabeka Falls, which is a next-door neighbour to our location for the last 5 years.

We want to thank everyone in our community who has supported us in any manner over the last 5 years. Whether it's been a kind recommendation of our services to a friend or neighbour or utilizing our pharmacy services and trusting us with your day-to-day healthcare needs - it's the community support that has made this project a real possibility to advance the access of health services in our community.

This marks another milestone for our pharmacy, but also a major milestone for the development of services in our community. We couldn't have imagined what the last five years would bring if you asked us when we first opened our doors.

- February 2017: We opened the doors to our first pharmacy location in Kakabeka Falls.
- January 2018: We opened the doors to our Rosslyn pharmacy location.
- November 2019: Both locations become 100% locally owned by pharmacists and partners Henry Tempelman and Devon Myers.
- April 2021: Rebranding from IDA Pharmacy to Evergreen Pharmacy.
- May 2021: Announcement of the building project for a new pharmacy building in Kakabeka Falls.
- September 2021: Perhol Construction Ltd breaks ground for the new pharmacy building in Kakabeka Falls.
- June 2022: Evergreen Pharmacy is open for business in new building in Kakabeka Falls!
- Tentatively August/September 2022: New primary care clinic organization coming! (Announcement coming June 2022)

And that doesn't even count a pandemic that we (pharmacy staff and community) have all been working through together!

We truly appreciate the support of our rural community through these past five years. It's important to reflect on the growth of services in our com-

munity with your support. This project is evidence in the positive changes that strong support for local business can have when there is commitment from local business and community.

We'd also like to thank all our wonderful staff for their hard work and commitment to our patients. We have an amazing team of people who make our pharmacies a place where the focus is on the patient, and nobody feels like a number. We've grown from a staff of 4 people when we first opened in 2017 to 15 today (and growing!).

Now that we are open in our location, the work isn't finished. The last few weeks in our old location and first few weeks in our new location is a transitionary period. We appreciate your patience while we settle in and get back to our regular workflow. We are very excited for the extra space in the pharmacy dispensary, our own private pharmacist consultation room for health teaching and vaccines, the extra computer workstations for more staff to access patient records to improve service, the extra space to expand services to provide addiction treatments such as methadone/suboxone and a larger over-the-counter medication selection.

You'll still find our lovely gift shop in our pharmacy, and good news: it's going to have more space too! A larger selection of gifts, including more local vendors, as we continue to grow and expand our collection so you can always find something unique for that special person (or yourself ).

New to come: a coffee bar! We have a coffee bar with 6-8 seats where we will serve regular coffees, lattes, cappuccinos, espresso-based drinks, iced coffees, etc. along with baked goods and sandwiches. We are targeting an opening date in the second week of June. We have some new staff with friendly smiles that are just as important in the morning as that caffeine intake. Pharmacists are also at their best when they are well-caffeinated!

Now, the question that everyone has been asking: "What else is going in there?" We are finalizing the details, but by the end of June we expect to

have a public announcement with which organizations are going to be joining us in the new space. What I can say, is that this addition to the Kakabeka community is going to be another huge milestone that we can add to our list above. The clinic suite has four exam rooms with the opportunity for collaborative practice between allied health professionals providing services to the area. This presents so much opportunity to offer a multitude of services in a state-of-theart space in Kakabeka, where there was previously no infrastructure for these types of services.

With that being said, the Good Doctors Telemedicine Clinic will be ending its operations in Kakabeka Falls. We want to offer them a sincere thank you to them for offering medical services to our underserved community. Unfortunately, there will be a small gap this summer where medical walk-in services won't be available in Kakabeka Falls, but it will be a small step back for two (or three!) big steps forward in the health services that are coming to the community! If you require refills and were depending on the Good Doctors clinic, our pharmacists are available to provide extensions on chronic medications, as necessary, or we can refer you to other walk-in clinics available in-person in Thunder Bay or via telemedicine.

Again, thank you to everyone for your support over the years! We look forward to serving you from our new home in Kakabeka Falls, and also continuing in our busy little Rosslyn location!
